

17TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

MARRIAGE IN THE CATHOLIC CHURCH

Marriage, more properly called in the Roman Catholic Church: *The Holy Sacrament of Matrimony*, is one of the Seven Sacraments of the Church. Even though the words Marriage and Matrimony are frequently used interchangeably, there is significant difference between the meaning and the effect of each term. I have been doing a lot of thinking about this since Christmas of 2016, when our daughter Melissa announced to my wife Linda and me, that she had become engaged to be married to Donald Lopuzzo. Both Melissa and Don are members of St. Philip Parish and are very active in our Music Ministry. They also told me that they wanted me to be the Officiant at their celebration of Holy Matrimony. Fast forward one and a half years . . . that Holy Sacrament took place earlier this month. What a joyful day it was!

Marriage is defined by Merriam-Webster Dictionary as: *"the state of being united as spouses in a consensual and contractual relationship recognized by law"*. Marriage is a very good thing! Jesus himself says in the Gospel: *"From the beginning of creation, God made them male and female. For this reason, a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh. Therefore, what God has joined together, no human being must separate."* (Mark 10:6-9)

The lawful contractual relationship that takes place in marriage also takes place within the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony. However, there is more. Jesus transformed marriage into a Sacrament by working his very first miracle at the Wedding at Cana by transforming clean, fresh water into the finest wine for the wedding guests to enjoy (John 2:1-11). This transformation added an entirely new Sacramental dimension to Christian marriage.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church describes the Sacraments as: *"efficacious signs of grace, instituted by Christ and entrusted to the Church, by which divine life is dispensed to us...They bear fruit in those who receive them with the required dispositions"*(CCC 1131). The Catechism also teaches that the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony signifies the union of Christ with his Church. This

Sacrament gives to the spouses the grace to love each other with the kind of love that Christ loves his Church. It gives them the grace of the sacrament which perfects their human love, strengthens their unity and sanctifies them on their journey to eternal life (CCC 1661).

So, Marriage is a very good thing. It is like the clean, fresh water at the Wedding at Cana. Water is vital to our lives and is the very essence of our existence. The effect of the Sacrament of Holy Matrimony elevates that goodness of marriage to a higher level. It elevates it just as Jesus transformed that pure water into the finest wine. It is our faith in Jesus Christ which opens the souls of those to be married to the power of the Sacrament. It is through that faith that the spouses are not only joined to each other, but that Jesus also binds himself to their union.
