
MARCH 8, 2020 SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

During this Season of Lent, you are invited to participate in our theme: *Our Call and Journey - Love in Action* through: Homilies, Bulletin & Website articles, YouTube presentations - (YouTube.com/stphilipclifton), and by performing *Acts of Love* (forms of Lenten penance).

THEME HISTORY

Shortly before our parish fire in 2018 we began the process of designing Stained Glass Windows as a celebration of our 75th Jubilee Year. With the prayerful input of our Liturgical Design Committee, Liturgical Architect and the artists Butler/Vargo, Inc., Indianapolis, IN., thirteen windows are designed and in production with an estimated installation in June.

THE IMAGE

The image depicted above is a close-up photograph of **Stained Glass Window I**, which shows the hand of Christ and a profile of the hand of the artist Brad Butler using an artist's cloth while working on the window. The symbolism of Christ's hand and the artist's hand touching is an example of Brad using his gifts and talents to be **Love in Action** through his work. The image of the completed window (which will be shown in a few weeks) depicts Jesus reaching out his hand to Call our Parish patron St. Philip to do Christ's work. We, like St. Philip and our artist Brad, are **Called** by Christ to **Journey** hand in hand with the Lord and with each other. We are **Called** to live our lives using our gifts and talents to do Christ's Work by being **Love in Action** in our words and deeds.

Reflection on Journey - Week III

Calvin takes his 91-year-old grandmother to have her hair cut, set and shaped. As Granny's chair is twirled around for her to see her new look, the hair stylist says, "Oh, you look ten years younger!" The grandmother wrinkles up her nose at her image in the mirror and sighs. "What's the matter?" they ask her. Granny says, "Who wants to look 81!"

At any age change is inevitable. Part of our human condition is the constant transformation of our bodies, minds, hearts and spirits. Often, we focus on the negative aspects of change particularly aging. I am sure that if asked to reflect on her life, the Granny in the story would be able to list many positive changes in character, in wisdom and in her ability to love and understand for which she could be grateful.

Today's Gospel tells the story of the Transfiguration of Jesus on the mountain. The Transfiguration points to the transformation that we, made in the image and likeness of God, experience through the working of the Holy Spirit in our lives. Our journey in life begins with our creation by God in Glory. Through our lives we grow in love, wisdom and understanding through our joys, sorrows, sacrifice and sufferings. God's power is at work in us as we are forgiven, healed and empowered through Scripture, Sacraments and our Christian community. As we embrace our spiritual selves we can gratefully say, "Here I am Lord, sharing your gifts as I hold your people in my heart." One day through our embrace of the Paschal Mystery we, like Christ, suffer, die and are reborn again in Glory. Our journey is from Glory to Glory. (2 Corinthians 3:18)

Reflection on how we are being transformed into the image and likeness of Christ is a central part of our spiritual journey. We examine our conscience to find areas where we may be sinful or in need of God's healing touch. It is also vital to examine our conscience to acknowledge the power of God at work in our life Transfiguring us as we live our lives as Love in Action. Scripture encourages us to reflect on the positive work of God's strong hand embracing us in our works of love.

Scripture Reflection

"Rejoice in the Lord always; again, I say, rejoice. Whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is admirable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. Keep on doing these things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in God, and the God of peace will be with you." (Philippians 4: 4, 8, 9)

ACTIVITY LOVE IN ACTION

Lenten penance is a prayerful way to take actions that remind us of God's **Call** to awaken to God's presence in all things on the **Journey.** Changing our routines and patterns of behavior grab our attention and may focus us on the spiritual dimension (A common penance, for example, giving up some food). This Lent we suggest more positive, proactive Lenten penances called **Acts of Love**. These acts are relationship based and involve honoring the presence of God in each other on the journey through – courtesy, hospitality and responsible stewardship of ourselves, others and our world.

ACTS OF LOVE FOR LENT

- 1. Prayer: Tell God honestly your thoughts and feelings in prayer. Ask, 'Ok God, what's the good news?' Being honest with God alone is good news.
- **2. Hospitality:** "Welcome others as you would greet Christ." Be hospitable: Make eye contact, Smile, Shake Hands say Hello and Goodbye.
- **3. Graciousness:** Recognize the gift in every interaction through polite language: say Please, Thank you, You're Welcome. These are daily acts of respect and love (and are often neglected over time in relationships).
- **4. Stewardship:** Ask prayerfully, Lord, what do I have to offer to this situation as *Love in Action* in word or in deed?
- **5. Recycling:** Our world is God's gift for which we are responsible. What behaviors of mine need to change that contribute to a cleaner, safer and resource friendly environment for me and others.
- 6. Peacemaking: Blessing those with whom we are not at peace is an Act of Faith in which we trust God to heal us. It does not necessarily change circumstances or other people but opens us to God's grace, DONA NOBIS PACEM GRANT US PEACE. Prayer "Bless (PERSON'S NAME) and transform me to set me free."

Prayer cards are available with the image above on the front side and the prayer below on the reverse side. Pray this prayer daily and both perform and share with the Lord your LOVE IN ACTION.

NEW LITURGICAL PRACTICES TO HALT SPREAD OF CORONA VIRUS

Due to the Corona Virus now confirmed in NJ and the International health initiatives to halt its spread the following practices are effective immediately at St. Philip the Apostle Parish:

- Holy Water fonts are empty
- Handshake of peace will be expressed through a bow or wave
- Eucharistic Ministers and clergy will Sanitize hands before and after distribution of Holy Communion
- Communion from the Cup is temporarily discontinued
- Communion reception on the tongue is not an option.
