

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

My Dear Parishioners,

The love of the Sacred Heart of Jesus is what the Samaritan woman in today's Gospel Reading is seeking. Jesus knows better than she does what kind of thirst is in her heart. She's looked for love in many places, but has failed in her search. Jesus wants to offer her the love that can only come from God. He offers the same to us during Lent.

One of the guideposts that God has given to help us is the Ten Commandments. The Ten Commandments, of course, fall into two parts. In our whole life on earth, God really asks only two things: to love God and to love our neighbor.

Yet there's a reason that God put the First through Third Commandments before the other seven. Just as prayer must be the source of our good works, so following the first three commandments helps us to follow the latter seven. Giving God His due is needed to have a heart open to the love of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, which in turn we are meant to share with our neighbor.

God's First Commandment is: "I am the Lord, your God. You shall not have other gods before me." This commandment forbids fashioning one's own gods when God Himself does not meet our expectations. In our own day, there is no end to the suggestions that the world makes about possible substitutes for God: money, sexuality, power, etc.

One way to reflect on whether the things in our lives are challenging God for First Place is to imagine what our reaction would be if something was taken away from us or destroyed. What if your home, along with all your vehicles, burned completely to the ground? Would you be distraught? Or would your response be like that of Job in the Old Testament, who recognized that every thing in his life was a gift from God that he did not deserve. Would your response be like that of Jesus on the Cross, who in His complete poverty still chose to act out of divine love?

The Second Commandment calls us to respect our God in a unique way. "You shall not take the Name of the Lord, your God, in vain." The name of a person represents that person. Throughout the scriptures we see God giving new names to individuals as signs of their identities and missions among the People of God.

The name of God is All-Holy, just as God Himself is All-Holy. To abuse the name of God is to

abuse God Himself. For Christians, there are only two valid ways in which to speak the Name of God: first, for prayer; second, for leading another towards God in holy conversation, including teaching.

The Third Commandment concerns the fact that Christians are not only called to have a personal relationship with God but are also to have a spiritual relationship with other Christians, and that together Christians are to worship God. "Keep holy the Lord's Day." Sunday is the day of the week on which Jesus rose from the dead, and because of this, Christians have always honored Sunday as the "eighth day" of the week, the day on which a new creation was established by God.

Every Sunday, Catholics are obliged by their baptismal promises to share in public worship at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. Missing Mass is an offense against God's love because the Mass is the form of worship He gave us at the Last Supper. Jesus didn't say at the Last Supper, "Play a round of golf in memory of me." He didn't say, "Catch up on your sleep in memory of me." Jesus confirmed and specified the meaning of the Third Commandment at the Last Supper, telling us: "Do this in memory of me."



WHY, FATHER?" by Fr. Emerson

Q: Father, when Jesus speaks to the Samaritan woman about “living water,” 💧 is that just symbolic language—or does it prove something real about who He is? And why does she leave her water jar behind? 🤔 ✨

A: This Gospel is not merely poetic—it is profoundly theological. Jesus begins tired and thirsty 🍷 🥤, showing He is truly human. Yet in the same conversation, He offers “living water” that becomes “a spring welling up to eternal life.” 💧 🔥 No prophet ever claimed to give eternal life. Only God can give divine life. By offering it, Jesus reveals His identity as more than teacher—He is **the source of salvation** ✚.

In the Old Testament, “living water” symbolized God’s own life and Spirit (Jer 2:13) 📖. When Jesus claims He can give this water, He is implicitly claiming divine authority. Then He reveals knowledge of the woman’s hidden past 👁️—proof of supernatural insight—yet responds not with shame, but mercy ❤️. Truth and compassion meet in Him.

Another powerful moment: Jesus crosses social and religious barriers 🌍. Jews avoided Samaritans. Rabbis avoided public conversations with women. Yet Jesus seeks her out. Salvation is universal, not tribal.

And then something beautiful happens: **she leaves her jar** 🪸. Why? Because she has found something greater than the water she came for. The jar represents her old thirst—daily survival, routine, perhaps even her burdens. Encountering Christ reorders her priorities. She forgets the jar because she has found living water. 💧 ✨

She runs back to the town 🚶 🔥 and becomes a missionary. Authentic encounter leads to evangelization. The townspeople eventually proclaim: “*This is truly the Savior of the world.*” 🌍 ✚ Not just a prophet—**the Savior**.

The jar left behind is a quiet but powerful symbol: when Christ satisfies the soul, lesser thirsts lose their grip.

Lent asks us: what jars are we still clinging to? Because Jesus still waits at the well, offering not temporary relief—but eternal life. 💧 🙏 ✨


